About the Workshop

The WRAP team has developed multiple strategies to effectively support youth who live at the axes of complex traumas and unpredictable supports. Within this demographic, a large percentage of our female-identifying youth carry risk factors which make them vulnerable for victimization of sexual exploitation and human trafficking.

This workshop presentation will outline these strategies within our specific context: we will describe the therapeutic pedagogies that inform our work, while illustrating them with stories of the complex challenges our youth face within the medical, judicial, social and educational systems. We will outline the approaches we take to community collaboration, personal relationship, community safety and self-reflection as we navigate the gray areas of this work.
